

Introduction

Situated beside the shitalakshya river, Narayanganj is one of the most important port cities of Bangladesh. It is called “golden gate” of capital Dhaka, also renowned as the “Dundee of the east”. Country’s biggest RMG sector has also been established on the centre of the city. For these definite reasons a huge crowd of people has been gathered in the city for last few decades. But there was always a need for quality education in the mind of people. There were two government colleges on the nearby thana but in the Sadar thana there was no college that can fulfil the demand of standard education. In this state of affairs, in 1st march of 1980, after after the nationalization of Tolaram college, a well-known educative, the erstwhile member of parliament, Late Hazi Jalal uddin Ahmed discussed with Mohkuma Commissioner (MC) Aminur Rahman about the situation and took initiative to establish a college in the centre of the city. His initiative was welcomed in every way by all the prominent persons. The position was chosen by them and took the land of PWD as lease for two years.

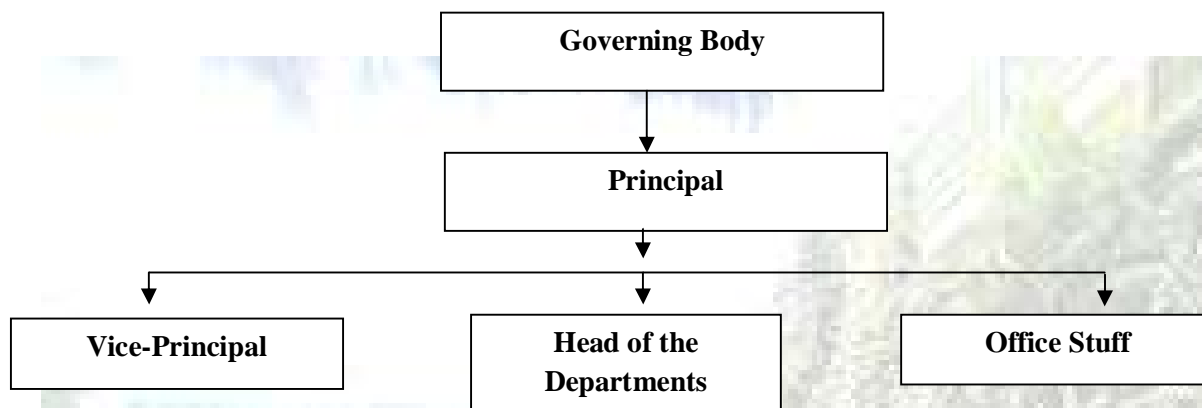

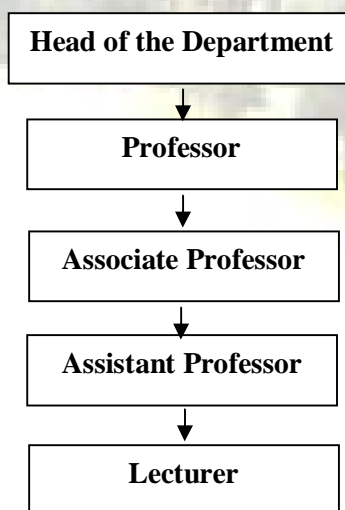
CHAPTER #01: OVERVIEW OF THE COLLEGE (INSTITUTIONAL AND ACADEMIC)

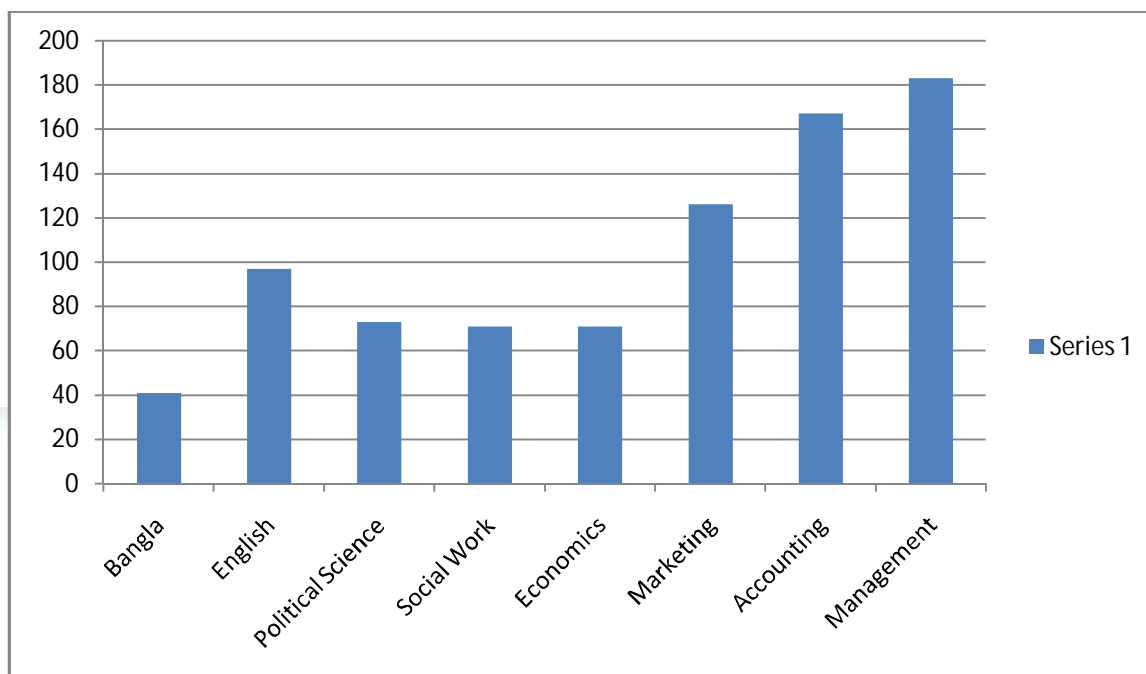

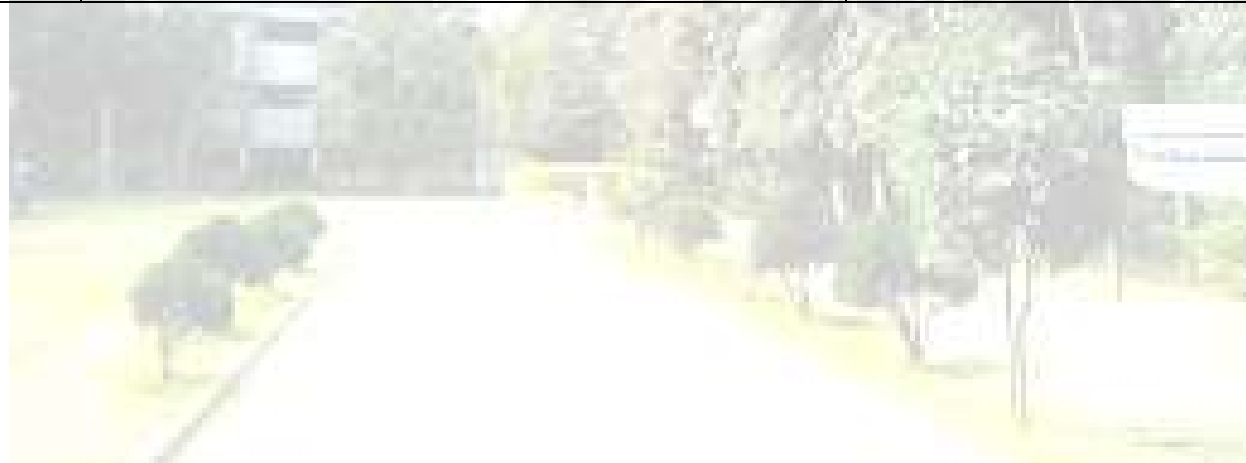

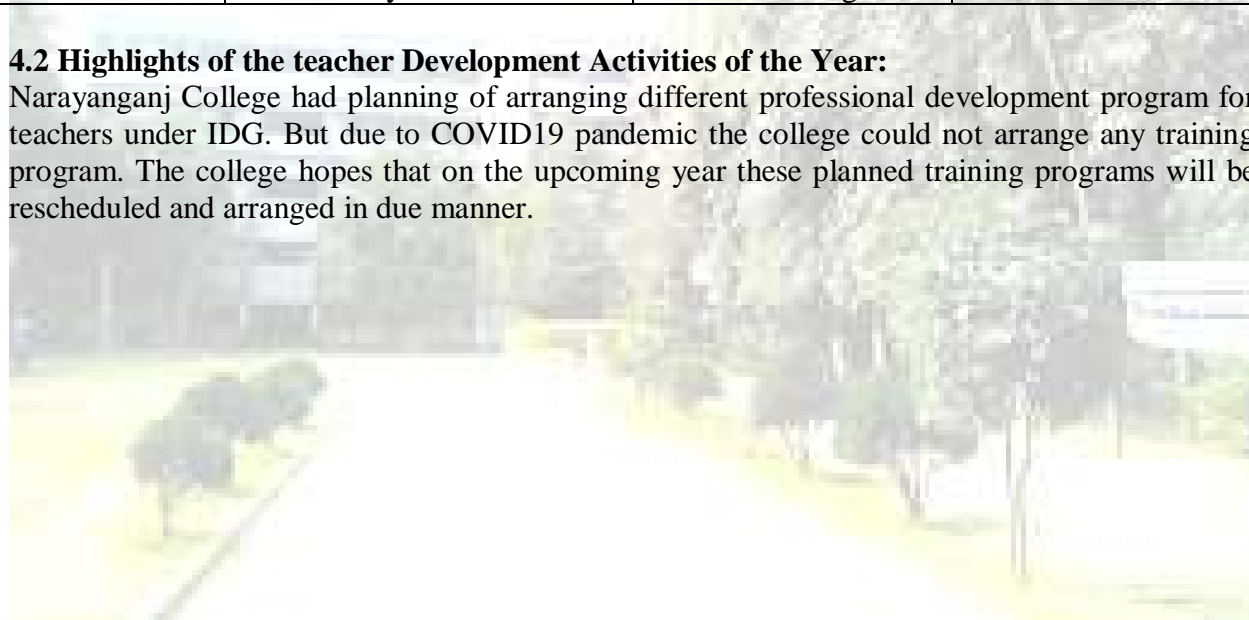
